



Out of the Box Modeling by Dick Hague

Editor's note: Dick shares a unique running text and visual diary of his modeling adventures which includes triumphs, defeats, lessons learned and tips. It is too tall of an order to pull together one complete build from the various messages, so what you are seeing in these articles is a moving "window" of Dick's modeling adventures over time. Nevertheless, we are getting a host of tips and lessons learned suitable for beginners and experienced modelers alike.

Back in the box??? I think most model builders know what that is. It is when you want to work on something other than what you have been doing but don't want to have another incomplete model taking up space in your working area. Usually, you pick something that involves building smaller assemblies that will fit back in the box when that urge is out of your system.

Here is how I handled this for a couple of hours. In an earlier BIB (Back Inbox) I had washed the contents of the Yak 2's box. This should always be a first step on any model build as it removes oils and other products of the manufacturing process. After it dried overnight the next BIB resulted in some interior bulkheads being installed inside half of the engine nacelles. There were a lot of attachment points that had to be trimmed and sanded before that could happen. The manufacturer (Amodel) doesn't employ any high-tech molding processes (Figure 1). While they have many interesting subjects, ease of assembly is a low priority with their kit designers!




I had been thinking about gluing together the top and bottom of the left and right wing halves and did just that. Here is where some tips start, not only on this kit but generally speaking! The arrows in the second picture point out molding flash on the leading edge of the wing (Figures 2 and 3). As long as the two pieces fit flat together don't remove this flash until after the glue dries otherwise you may have an indention that might have to be filled on the edge. Sand it smooth when the glue gets hard.




Look at parts 9 and 10 on the instructions and then on the real 9 and 10 (Figure 4). These parts look the same and almost are. They are the front and back of an internal weapons bay and due to fuselage taper might cause a fit problem when you try to join the fuselage halves. As soon as you cut and trim them from the molding sprue it will be difficult trying to tell which is front or back. Using this small permanent marker solves this problem. What about that ink? Several ways to deal with that, wipe off with paint thinner, sand off, paint over it, etc. It will be mostly invisible inside anyway. Lots of other small parts got identified while this was going on! Handy tool that marker!

Numbering parts on the sprue of what I consider a limited run kit doesn't guarantee that getting the numbered parts together per the instructions will be correct! Look at Figure 5 showing the engine nacelle assembly of which you need to make two and their parts, left and right, have the same number on the call out illustration, but.....

Notice on Figure 6 the difference in size of the left side's air intakes! In spite of being the same numbers the left halves are different as are the rights. Looking at other pictures large scoops should be on the fuselage side of each nacelle and the small ones face outboard. After gluing together <u>one</u> of these nacelles it was BIB!!

WWII 1/48 Carrier Decks by Jon Etherton

Accuscale Models makes some incredible 1/48 Laser cut WW2 Carrier Decks. A new Imperial Japanese Navy deck is now available.

During our Tips and Share calls over the summer, I have been showing off 1/48 laser-cut "wood" WW2 carrier decks from "Accuscale Models." They were created to serve as bases for displaying 1/48 scale naval aircraft models, and for dioramas. Along with their United States Navy (USN) WWI deck, Accuscale just released an Imperial Japanese Navy (IJN) WW2 deck based on historical references from the carrier Akagi.

In my view the quality of the detail and laser etching is outstanding. They include the elevator, tie-downs, and arrestor cable trenches (as appropriate) as the accompanying photos show. The decks, which sell for \$19.95 each, come with detailed instructions on assembly, painting and weathering and are available on eBay (search for Accuscale Models) or from Etsy at "AccuscaleModels-Etsy. On the same sites, you can also purchase the custom-cut and routed wood base (\$18.95) on which to mount the carrier deck sets.
