We are also exploring the introduction of a new category, tentatively titled "Mech," to better accommodate the growing interest in Gundam, Zoid, Armored Core, Megami, and related genres. This initiative will free up the Sci-Fi and Figures categories while providing proper representation for this dynamic area of the hobby. 

Hague's Corner Quite a Change by Dick Hague

This is a short update showing the views on the modeling desk after that Yak roundup! This well along WWII German self-propelled gun (Figures 1 and 2) was going to get the late war German brown and green camouflage patches prior to some insignia decals but the old tin of green had become a nasty shade of brown over the years. Fortunately, the next modeling session will see a brand-new tin of that green opened and applied.

The Sikorsky H-19B rescue helicopter's door already has some tacky adhesive applied to it so that the door can be moved around wherever desired (Figure 3 next page). The yellow antenna in the upper left of the picture needs to be painted white and the green navigation light located between the AIR and FORCE marking needs to be painted green! The other side's light is already red (Figure 4 next page). The rotor is finished and just needs to be dropped down onto the shaft. The tail rotor's red and white stripes are on and just needs to be glued to the tail.

Left foreground of Figure 4 are a pair of P-39's or maybe P-63's.....my morning coffee hasn't clicked in yet! Whichever, the nearest one is a rather rare two-seat version. And yes, another Yak has snook back onto the desk but this time it is a Yak-18. The bad canopy problem is possibly solved and since this will be an all-black Korean War 'Bed check Charlie' version it was allowed to happen.

The red and gray H-19B at Figure 5 is in the same stage of completion as the yellow one except that the right sliding door is missing.....and has been for years. These two will be the completion of this batch of seven started in 2012. I like this kit and might do a few more (Figure 6)!

Completion of this USAF version on floats (Figure 7) allowed me to finally stop trying to fix the ancient Revell kit that I had built, probably the same or a year later than what was molded into the inside of the old kit (Figures 8 and 9)! Notice that dried clear blob of the old tube glue DUCO used back then. Also inside the old kit, this WAFB stood for 'Wrexham Air Force Base' which is what my model room was named when I was living on our farm that was named 'Wrexham' (Figure 10).









Tips and Share Meeting 21 May 2025




